LENT

"I invite you, therefor, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word." [BCP pg. 265]

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Through much prayer, sleepless nights, and lots of conversations with others, one aspect of our life at St. Francis has become abundantly clear to me:

We are at a Crossroads.

The last twelve years have been brutal. Our membership, outreach and finances have shrunk. This has occurred at the same time that Clearcreek Township and the City of Springboro have grown by about 20%, and the number of new Churches in our area has increased as well.

We sit on a great piece of property, with a handicap accessible building, near the intersection of two major roads. Why aren't we growing?? Do we lack the verve to carry out our Vision, or are we simply picking the wrong things to spend our time, talent and treasure on in proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ?

Three points:

- 1) Saint Francis is in a growing community.
- Saint Francis is shrinking instead of growing.
- 3) The membership of St. Francis, particularly the leadership, is tired.

What will lead us out of slow death into renewed growth?

- Prayer. Not just on Sunday mornings, but prayer throughout the week. Not perfunctory prayers, but deep abiding prayer, both individually and corporately.
- Connecting with the Diocese to seek counsel, direction and assistance in charting our course forward. Let me be clear, I am NOT primarily talking about financial assistance, but wise counsel.
 Some of that counsel may be very painful, but there will be no change of direction without pain.
- 3) Long term clergy presence. All of the studies I have read regard the presence of a long term clergy leader (> 5-7 years) is one of the *essential* components to moving a shrinking congregation into a growing congregation.
 - And NO, I am not that clergy person!
- The sacrificial giving of time, talent and treasure to St. Francis for the sake of the Gospel by ALL members.

More on this in the days ahead (particularly the Annual Meeting) but let me HIGHLY recommend that the Season of Lent is THE time, to begin the fervent prayer that must proceed and undergird all of the above.

Please pray with me this prayer throughout Lent:

"Gracious Father, we pray for thy holy Catholic Church. Fill it with all truth, in all truth with all peace.

Where it is corrupt, purify it; where it is in error, direct it; where in any thing it is amiss, reform it. Where it is right, strengthen it; where it is in want, provide for it; where it is divided, reunite it; for the sake of Jesus Christ thy Son our Savior. Amen." [BCP pg. 816]



St. Francis will have its annual Ash Wednesday Services on Wednesday, February 22. The season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday. On this day, Christians gather to begin the journey towards the Cross and the Resurrection with the Ash Wednesday service.

Imposition of ashes will be offered during two in-person services:

Noon: Traditional Rite I Mass without music

6:00 pm: Traditional Rite II Mass with instrumental music (Streamed online)



St. Francis will be hosting Stations of the Cross every Saturday for the season of Lent at 9:30 am. The Stations of the Cross are a 14-step devotion that commemorates Jesus Christ and the day of His crucifixion.

Stations of the Cross, also called Way of the Cross, are a series of 14 pictures or carvings portraying events in the Passion of Christ, from his condemnation by Pontius Pilate to his entombment.

The series of stations is as follows:

- (1) Jesus is condemned to death,
- (2) he is made to bear his cross,
- (3) he falls the first time,
- (4) he meets his mother,
- (5) Simon of Cyrene is made to bear the cross,
- (6) Veronica wipes Jesus' face,
- (7) he falls the second time,
- (8) the women of Jerusalem weep over Jesus,
- (9) he falls the third time,
- (10) he is stripped of his garments,
- (11) he is nailed to the cross,
- (12) he dies on the cross,
- (13) he is taken down from the cross, and
- (14) he is placed in the sepulchre. The images are usually mounted on the inside walls of a church or chapel but may also be erected in such places as cemeteries, corridors of hospitals and religious houses, or on mountainsides.
