The New Year is upon us and the calendar turn can serve as point of reflection for each of us. We may look back on this last year with both joy and with regret. We may both celebrate accomplishments and lament losses. We may confess things done and left undone, and then as Christians we will look ahead as forgiven children of God, beloved and believing the truth that "if anyone is in Christ, they are a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come."

What is the new thing God wants to give birth to in your life this year? Where is God calling you to tend to the soil of your life?

Perhaps God is calling you into deeper knowledge of the scriptures?

Adult Bible Study restarts on Wednesday's with a focus on Ecclesiastes, wisdom literature from the Hebrew Scriptures that has a lot to say about changing seasons.

Maybe you want to develop a personal practice of reading scripture, but need some help? I would recommend, *The Blue Parakeet* by Scot McKnight, a book that invites us to read the Bible, not as an ancient text to decode, but as those who continue to carry on the story written by our forbearers in the faith. *The New Testament for Everyone* is a wonderful companion guide to reading through books of the Bible in the New Testament if you are looking for easy to engage perspective to help you navigate through tough passages.

Perhaps God is calling you to serve in a new way this year?

St. Francis has many opportunities to serve, whether caring for the building or hosting coffee hour. One area in need of volunteers is in our liturgical life. Liturgy is the work of the people, our shared worship of Jesus Christ. We need volunteers to serve as lectors (reading the scripture) or acolytes (carrying the cross and assisting the priest as the communion table). Barb Roy is always on the lookout for new members of Altar Guild. Altar Guild helps prepare the church for worship, accentuating the beauty of Episcopal worship. Beyond St. Francis, two great local organizations in need of volunteers are both the Springboro Community Assistance Center, who provide food and material assistance to distressed families in Springboro and Family Promise, who provide housing and furnishings for distressed families in Warren County.

There are many ways God might be giving birth to something new, in our personal life, family life, vocational life, or in our life as a church, but keep in mind that God will always surprise us, so we keep our eyes peeled, ears open and hearts soft because as the Proverbs teach us, "The human mind plans the way, but the Lord directs the steps."

I look forward to the new thing that God is going to do at St. Francis, even as I look forward to my new call to serve at Trinity Columbus. I am grateful for the opportunity to celebrate with you one last time this New Year and I hope to offer you a blessing on Sunday, January 2^{nd} , just as each of you have been a blessing at the outset of my ordained ministry and a beacon of love for our family.

David Culp is inviting people to come and help out around the church building once a week.


There are several projects that need to be updated around the church, and any help would be very much appreciated.

A Message from Bishop Smith

Dear Friends,

Our world is entering a second Christmas season in the time of COVID, and although Church is closer to "normal" than a year ago, the sobering reality of a new variant is upon us. Yesterday Ohio recorded the highest number of COVID cases since the pandemic began, almost two years ago. It was timely, then, that our Diocesan Medical Task Force also met yesterday to review the data.

At the celebration of our Savior's birth this year, let us remember God's gift of love—and Jesus' own commandment to love God and to love our neighbor. Protecting one another from COVID is a crucial expression of God's love in our lives. To this end, I remind everyone of the guidelines from our Diocesan COVID Task Force. These are not new guidelines but an emphasis on the ones already in place.

- Masks work—so wear one, regardless your vaccination status. Wear a KN95 mask if available, since this mask is the most effective at preventing disease spread.
- Distancing works, six feet at least. To the extent that they can, congregations should also stream Christmas services online, for the sake of those who cannot be physically present.
- Vaccination works, and the booster helps. Our people and clergy do well to encourage one another to get their shots.
- Because it is the safest practice, communion remains in one kind, the consecrated bread only.

I wish all of you all the blessings of the season, a very merry Christmas and a blessed New Year.
