"10 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power. ¹¹ Put on the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. ¹² For our struggle is not against enemies of blood and flesh, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. ¹³ Therefore take up the whole armour of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm. ¹⁴ Stand therefore, and fasten the belt of truth around your waist, and put on the breastplate of righteousness. ¹⁵ As shoes for your feet put on whatever will make you ready to proclaim the gospel of peace. ¹⁶ With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. ¹⁷ Take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." [Ephesians 6:10-17 NRSV, emphasis added]

Dear Friends in Christ,

Like many of you, I was devastated by the massacre of the innocents (21 dead) at an elementary school in Uvalde, TX on May 24. This, combined with the shootings in Buffalo, New York (10 dead) on May 14, and elsewhere throughout our country in May ALONE, leads me to ask: "WHY GOD WHY???"

And this morning (June 2), 4 dead at a hospital in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

And all of this is on top of the hundreds of children who have been killed in the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

The debate over gun control in the United States is running at a white hot frenzy....so frenzied that those with differing opinions seem uncapable of listening to each other, much less cooperating together.

Let me compare the gun violence in this country and the world to a person suffering serious bleeding. That person arrives in the Emergency Department of one of our hospitals. The medical staff's first response is to STOP THE BLEEDING. In other words, their first response is to the presenting SYMPTOM. As they seek to control the bleeding, attention becomes focused on WHY bleeding has occurred. In other words, what is the CAUSE of the bleeding.

TREAT the SYMPTOM => DISCOVER the CAUSE. Symptoms need to be treated immediately; causes may take days or weeks of months to properly diagnose and treat. Ask my wife Molly.

It seems to me that the loudest perspectives on Gun Violence are focused on assigning (rather than discovering) the CAUSE, and have confused CAUSE with SYMPTOMS.

For Christians, especially Episcopalians, we believe that the CAUSE of Gun Violence is "Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickednesss that rebel against God". The Letter to the Ephesians is very specific about what we how we are to act in this fight against Evil.

We are also very clear about how we are to respond to the SYMPTOMS in this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God. Pray for the grace to listen to those "across the aisle" so that we may come as a country to a consensus on how to treat the SYMPTOMS of Gun Violence.

Summer of Sharing Our Gifts June 12, 2022, through September 4, 2022




Summer of Sharing Our Gifts. We need your help. All that we are and all that we have are gifts from God.
