"WHAT (OR WHOM) ARE YOU LOOKING FOR??"

Recently Dr. Vivek H. Murthy, Surgeon General of the United States, issued an Advisory entitled "Our Epidemic of Loneliness and Isolation" (2023). The document is 82 pages long and can be found here:

The Advisory provides solid research into why Americans of all backgrounds, races, genders, socioeconomic status, etc., are finding themselves more isolated than ever from meaningful relationships and community. This may surprise many who read this, because of the explosive growth in social media and web based communication resources over the last two decades, but to paraphrase an old cigarette slogan, "we are interacting more, but enjoying it less". The lack of meaningful, deep, connection with others has lead to a number of health and economic issues, including early death.

In short, people in our country are yearning for meaningful, deep, connections in their lives, but are not finding places where such relationships can be developed.

But wait, you may ask, isn't the Church a place where these meaningful, deep relationships are meant to be found and developed? After all, aren't we as Christians commanded by Jesus to "love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, and with all our mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: you shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." [Matthew 22:37-40].

Or put another way, aren't we created by God to have meaningful, deep, relationships with God and with our fellow human beings? Isn't that who we aspire to be as Christians here at St. Francis?

Sadly, for many lonely people, the Christian Community is the last place they will look for the remedy to loneliness and isolation. For some, their experience with the Church has been one where they have felt rejection, isolation, or avoidance. Others have heard of these stories of rejection and don't want to experience the pain their friends and acquittances have felt.

So what are we to do as Christians? How do we, at St. Francis, invite the lonely and isolated into lifegiving relationships with God, with us and with each other?

The Episcopal Church's Office of Public Affairs released the <u>following statement</u> on May 30 with information about medical care Presiding Bishop Michael Curry is receiving for internal bleeding and an irregular heartbeat.

Over Memorial Day weekend, Episcopal Church Presiding Bishop Michael Curry was admitted to the hospital in Raleigh, North Carolina, where he underwent testing for internal bleeding and a heart condition. He has been discharged and will be monitored while working on a reduced schedule from home.

Curry's internal bleeding is under control, and additional test results are expected later this week. He has been receiving treatment for atrial fibrillation (AFib), which was detected in an annual physical. While in the hospital, Curry experienced two other episodes of irregular heartbeat, and he will wear a heart monitor to determine what further treatment is necessary.

Until he is cleared for air travel by his medical team, Curry will remain in Raleigh, resting and working from home on a reduced schedule. As more information becomes available regarding Curry's health and schedule, his staff will provide updates.

Please pray for a full and speedy recovery—and for Curry's medical team as they identify the best course of treatment.

The Rev'd. Jed Dearing has been elected Rector of Trinity Episcopal Church in Columbus Ohio! Fr. Jed's tenure as Rector officially begins on July 1, 2023.

Jed was ordained in 2020 in the Diocese of Southern Ohio. After completing his Master of Divinity at the Church Divinity School of the Pacific, Jed served as Clergy in Residence at St. Francis Episcopal Church in Springboro. Jed has served as Associate Rector at Trinity since January of 2022 where he has shared in liturgical leadership and formation while leading initiatives to grow community, strengthen outreach, build Diocesan partnerships and expand worshiping opportunities.


