Bible Study on October 31

No homework, no dogma, just exploration.

Tuesday Morning Prayer on November 14

Morning Prayer is part of the Daily Offices found in the Episcopal Book of Common Prayer and typically lasts thirty minutes. We pray the Psalms, read scripture, learn about a saint, pray for the needs and concerns of our lives and give thanks to God.

Care Team on November 7

Congregational Care welcomes members and visitors to St. Francis and helps care for all parishioners who become involved in the life of the parish.

Sunday School and Youth Choir on November 21

Sunday School currently serves children ages 6 to 13. Sunday School meets during the first half of the 10:30 am service. Children hear lessons, create art, form a youth choir and engage questions of faith They rejoin their family for worship at The Peace each Sunday. At times the youth share their talents through Christmas Pageants and performances of the Youth Choir.


147th Diocesan Convention

Feast of St. Andrew the Apostle

Tuesday, November 30 at Noon Join us in the sanctuary for this simple Noonday celebration of Eucharist on the Feast of St. Andrew

Most biographical notes on this Apostle begin "Andrew was Simon Peter's brother," and he is so described in the Gospels. Identifying Andrew as Peter's brother makes it easy to know who he is, but it also makes it easy to overlook the fact of Andrew's own special gift to the company of Christ. The Gospel according to John tells how Andrew, a disciple of John the Baptist, was one of two disciples who followed Jesus after John had pointed him out, saying, "Behold the Lamb of God" (John 1:29). Andrew and the other disciple went with Jesus and stayed with him, and Andrew's first act afterward was to find his brother and bring him to Jesus. We might call Andrew the first missionary in the company of disciples. The Gospel of Matthew records Jesus' calling Andrew and others from occupation as fisherman, and their immediate response to his call. Andrew was also the disciple who brought the boy with the loaves and fishes to Jesus for the feeding of the multitude.

St. Francis is working with FLOC again this year to bring Christmas to more than 1800 children. In most instances the gifts provided by FLOC will be the only presents these children will receive. FLOC (For Love of Children) is a totally volunteer organization, providing support for children throughout the Greater Dayton Area who may be abused or neglected; children in foster care; and children in need of specialized community resources. Parishioner Beth Mann is the volunteer President of FLOC.

Among FLOC's many and varied programs is their annual Christmas For Kids program. This year St. Francis will be collecting toys. Please place the TOYS in the FLOC box which will be located in the Commons. The toys should be NEW and UN-WRAPPED. NO EDIBLE GIFTS such as cookies or candy should be placed in the box. 
