Dear Friends in Christ,

As I have stated on many occasions, I had three specific goals to accomplish during my time with you:

To define and articulate the WHY of the St. Francis Community.

To define and articulate the Mission of the St. Francis Community to the City of Springboro and beyond.

To define and articulate the qualifications of the next clergy persons(s) who will serve the St. Francis Community after my time with you is ended.

The Mission Statement we have agreed upon in Vestry is:

## "The Mission of Saint Francis Episcopal Church is to proclaim the healing and transformative power of Jesus Christ to a hurting world."

Everything we do as a Community of Faith should ultimately be based on our Mission Statement. *Everything*.

As my time with you has increased, I've discovered that part of the task that God has given me is to address the ministries and activities of the St. Francis Community in light of our Mission; specifically, what is the BEST allotment of our time, talent, and treasure during this season in our parish's life, the life of the Episcopal Church, and the life of our Springboro Community – and beyond. As the Preacher reminds us in Ecclesiastes, we find ourselves in different seasons of life at various times. The hardest (at least for me) are the seasons of transitions.

We are in such a season of transitions now. The amount and variety of time, talent, and treasure that we can offer to God, both as individuals and as members of St. Francis, are different than they were even a few short years ago. Here are some of the questions I have started asking, and will continue to ask:

What is the role of the clergy in the life and ministry of St. Francis? What is the best distribution of ministry roles for the next clergy? Will that cleric or clerics be Sunday Supply, part-time, full-time, or shared with other Episcopal congregations among us?

What is the role of the lay Parish Leadership at St. Francis? How many persons should comprise the Vestry (by Diocesan Canon a Vestry [Wardens and Vestry members] can consist of as few as five and as many as fifteen Parish Members). What should their duties and responsibilities be as Vestry Members?

What ministries and activities should we be carrying out as a Parish? Remembering that such ministries and activities are ultimately based on our Mission and on the time, talent and treasure offerings of our members, what current ministries and activities need to be cut back or eliminated? What current ministries and activities need to be combined? What current ministries and activities need to be strengthened? What new ministries and activities do we need to develop?

What ministries and activities in our Parish need to be supported by paid staff, and what roles need to be completely volunteer?

All the above and more need to be evaluated based on our Mission and on the current resources of time, talent and treasure in our Parish!!

Finally, let me be clear that WHAT we do will depend on the time, talent and treasure of our Parish, but WHY we do anything is independent of the season, or the time, talent and treasure available to us. As Paul wrote Timothy, we are to preach the Good News of Jesus Christ by word and example to a hurting world! This is an awesome task, but God will give us the means and desire to carry this out!!

# From the Bishop Nominating Committee: Focus Groups

The <u>Bishop Nominating Committee</u> met for the first time at a retreat at the Procter Center on October 7 and 8, where we were commissioned and charged with beginning the process of choosing a new bishop for our diocese.

We have many steps to take in the <u>process</u>, and our first announcement is to ask members of the diocese to <u>register</u> for one or more of a series of focus groups, listed below, that will take place in October and November. During these focus groups, you will have a chance to share with us your concerns and hopes for the new bishop.

Ten focus groups will be held in person and six will be held virtually, via Zoom. One Zoom session and one in-person session will be conducted in Spanish. Some of the Zoom sessions will focus on the hopes and concerns of specific groups within our diocese, but there are two general "Zoom for anyone" sessions. Any member of the diocese may choose to attend any session.

These focus groups are important to our search process. We need to hear from you so that we can better discern what qualities are needed in our next bishop.

Please join us in praying for the search for the Tenth Bishop of Southern Ohio:

Almighty God, giver of every good gift: We thank you for the gift of your Son, Jesus Christ, and for the witness of your whole church in his name. We thank you for your Holy Spirit, empowering us for ministry. So guide the hearts and minds of all those who shall choose a bishop in this diocese and those who will respond to the call, that we may receive a faithful pastor who will care for your people. May our discernment transform our spirits and draw us closer to you, Almighty God. **Amen**.
