### THE PILGRIM PRIEST PONDERS CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP

It shall be the duty of Rectors or Priests-in-Charge to ensure that all persons in their charge are instructed concerning Christian stewardship, including:

- (i) reverence for the creation and the right use of God's gifts;
- (ii) generous and consistent offering of time, talent, and treasure for the mission and ministry of the Church at home and abroad;
- (iii) the biblical standard of the tithe for financial stewardship; and
- (iv) the responsibility of all persons to make a will as prescribed in the Book of Common Prayer.

[Constitution and Canons of the Episcopal Church, Canon III.9.6 (b)(2)]

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Earlier this year I taught on the need of all members of St. Francis (and regular visitors) ...to make wills, while they are in health, arranging for the disposal of their temporal goods, not neglecting, if they are able, to leave bequests for religious and charitable uses. [Book of Common Prayer, pg. 445]

In this Pondering, I want to consider (briefly), the role of financial stewardship in the life of Christians.

First, giving financially to St. Francis Episcopal Church is a *spiritual discipline* to help both the giver and the Parish grow in our ability to fulfill our Mission and Vision. I cannot emphasize too strongly that indicating each year what we plan to give to support our Mission and Vision is – like prayer, worship, Bible Study, etc. – primarily a *spiritual discipline*, NOT a means of "balancing the budget"!

Second, *preparing* a signed "Estimate of Giving" card and submitting the same as an offering is an *act of Worship*.

Third, the Estimate of Giving is NOT a contract, but an endorsement of what each member and/or family has prayerfully considered and discerned what God is calling them to give.

Fourth, the Tithe (10%) has been the standard in the Christian tradition for determining what to give. This is NOT a requirement in the Episcopal Church, but a valuable tool for determining your Estimate of Giving.

Fifth, how do you determine your Estimate of Giving? Here's my suggestion – and one that Molly and I will follow:

- a) Find your 2021 Income Tax Return.
- b) Go to line 9 (Total Income). Write that number down.
- c) Look up your pledged support to St. Francis for 2022 (if you can't find it, contact Sue Starner at *parishtreas@saintfran.org*).
- d) Take a deep breath.
- e) What percent of your total income is represented by your pledged support? Are you satisfied with this? If not, prayerfully consider increasing your pledge by \$10/week.

There have been times for Molly and me when we have been able to pledge our Estimate of Giving based on our gross incomes. There have been other times when we increased our pledge due to increases in our income throughout the year. Correspondingly, there have been times when we have had to drastically reduce our pledge because of financial hardships, retirements, etc. When these happen to you, it is good to notify Sue Starner.

The year 2021 was such a transition year for the Baileys. I can tell you that our Giving for Molly's parish was 5% of our combined gross income. Our discussion for the year 2023 will be how to prudently raise our Estimate of Giving back to 10% over a period of years.

More later. I will be working with the Vestry and preaching on Stewardship throughout the month of February.





### From the Standing Committee: Nominating Committee Members Announced

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ,

For nearly a month, the Standing Committee has been engaged in the prayerful work of selecting the members of the Bishop Nominating Committee. From 26 applicants, all of whom offered considerable gifts and skills, we have selected a committee of 15 members, and have also appointed a chaplain. The group represents the rich diversity of our diocese, and we are grateful to each person who has agreed to serve. You can find the Nominating Committee's roster on the new bishop search website at *https:// southernohiobishop.org/*, along with news updates, the timeline for the search, and other information about the process of seeking our next bishop. We are also glad to announce that the Rev. Gia Hayes-Martin, rector of St. John's, Worthington, has accepted our invitation to chair the Nominating Committee. She will convene the committee's retreat at Procter Center on October 7 and 8, when the committee will organize for business and assign other leadership positions and responsibilities. Throughout its work, the Nominating Committee will confer with consultant Anne Schmidt, who is providing experienced assistance to our search process.

Between now and next June, the Nominating Committee will be responsible for composing and circulating the diocesan profile; receiving applications for the position of bishop diocesan; and discerning the most appropriate candidates for the office. While the committee's work will be conducted confidentially, we will provide periodic updates about its progress. In particular, you can expect to hear more later this fall about how to offer the Nominating Committee input as it creates the diocesan profile.

In the meantime, we ask you to pray for the members of the Nominating Committee; for those whom they will discern to be our candidates for bishop; and for continued healing for our Standing Committee's president, Canon Scott Gunn.

Almighty God, giver of every good gift: Look graciously on your Church, and so guide the minds of those who shall choose a bishop for this Diocese, that we may receive a faithful pastor, who will care for your people and equip us for our ministries; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
